3 424	Climate Change and Local Councils Cllr Cornford proposed that Westgate on Sea Town Council promotes the awareness of the climate impacts of everyday actions by communities and individuals. To seek to create a positive shift in response to the climate change challenge. Members were invited to comment and contribute ideas for debate. Cllr Cornford spoke about single use plastic and the alternatives that are available which are growing in numbers and availability. There is work to be done to engage with the District Council around recycling improvements. Plastic Free Thanet is an example of one initiative in the area that can be supported by Council. Cllr Cornford will report back at the next meeting with further details to progress this project. It was debated that the use of plastic in general should not be demonised and a responsible/viable approach is needed to engage the community and educate.  It was moved by Cllr Calcutt and seconded by Cllr Donaldson and RESOLVED: that the Council will work on a project to promote awareness of the climate impacts of everyday actions by communities and individuals and actions that can be taken to create a positive shift in response to the climate change challenge.	
3425	PA System Town Clerk provided details of a second-hand publicaddress system that is used for outdoor events and has been offered to the Town Council for purchase. The Events, Tourism and Developments Sub-Committee have considered the proposal and recommend to Council the purchase of this equipment for use at various events including Remembrance. The details of the costs were shared with Members as new and the average cost of second-hand equipment.  It was moved by Cllr Wallin and seconded by Cllr Donaldson and RESOLVED: that the outdoor PA system equipment is purchased and a price of £600.00 is offered for the equipment.
