

Railway Station Celebrations

Monday 12th April 2021 marked the 150th Anniversary of Westgate-on-Sea Railway Station.

Before 1871 trains from London had just passed through on their way to Margate and Ramsgate. The new railway put Westgate-on-Sea firmly on the map. The first train to arrive left London Victoria at 10.30am and bought a number of officials from the London. Chatham and Dover Railway including the owner of the then Westgate Estate. Arriving at 1pm they met with locals where a short speech was given marking the opening of the Station.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions the 150th Anniversary Celebrations were also a very small affair. However Covid-19 (and the snow!) did not stop the special day from being marked. John Sandford, the Station Manager for South Eastern Trains and David Wornham. Passenger Services Director. also for South Eastern Trains, welcomed those in attendance and talked about the importance of the station for the community.

This was followed by a speech from Chairman of the Town Council Councillor Joanna Cornford and Dr Graham Field, Chairman of the Westgate Heritage Centre who discussed the history of the station.

A small exhibition was held in the station waiting room with photos, vintage signage and an example of 1980s railway uniform for residents to enjoy. To help add to the celebrations Westgateon-Sea Town Council Staff dressed in Victorian costume giving out leaflets of a historical walking tour created by Sally Whitworth from the Westgate Heritage Centre whilst music was played in the background.

Lorraine and Richard Hambidge, in conjunction with Westgate-on-Sea Community Spirt Craft Group, created bunting and a bespoke 150th Birthday Train Sign. Westgate-in-Bloom volunteers ensured the train station was looking its best and planted flowers in the raised beds outside the station entrance.

A bigger Exhibition celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Westgate-on-Sea Train Station will be held on 18th July 2021 (Town Anniversary Day) at the Lymington Road Community Centre. For more information please email: admin@westgateonsea.gov.uk.

Today's Youth is Tomorrows Future

A Local Youth Council is a platform for change and a means to better engage young people.

Nationally there is a clear appetite and enthusiasm for youth councils and associated projects. Indeed, over the last decade there has been an explosion of youth councils, cabinets, parliaments, and forums throughout the Country supported by local authorities. The leading charity in this area is the British Youth Council (BYC). This in turn is promoted and partly funded by the government department for "Digital. culture, Media and Sport". Who, incidentally, did a pretty good job of the British Olympic games in 2012. Anyway, the British Youth Council (BYC) is a UK charity dating back to 1963, where it came under the administration of the foreign office as part of the World Assembly of Youth. Which, somewhat anachronistically, had the original aim to unite young people against the forces of communism just after World War II.

The overall idea of a youth council is to actively involve and empower young people in local democracy and decision making. It has obvious direct educational benefits, allowing young people to better understand and appreciate the complexities and intricacies of local government and politics, which does seem to have been sadly neglected from school curriculums in recent years.

There are huge areas in which young people should have a say. Further education has become horrendously expensive, even though there are provisions for, not interest free, but cheap loans for graduates. It only just about makes further education affordable. Surely, it can be argued that education is a fundamental human right not a privilege. Input from young people on issues surrounding the education system should be particularly valued now, as the pandemic has the created the biggest disruption to the education system that has ever happened. Again, on such important issues as Britain's place in Europe is far more important to young people, as they will be ones to live with and indeed pay for good and bad decisions that have been made.

The primary indicator of success of a youth council is evidence of change, and one of the questions that's most frequently asked. When budgets are pressed, participation projects such as youth councils need to increasingly prove their worth – rightly so. It must be challenging, influencing, and changing things that concern young people or why does it exist.



Without cultural change, tangible change is at best challenging to achieve.

The youth council must be outward looking. Reaching out to other potentially partner organisations, like having a direct link to children's services. In addition, be able to adopt effective management methodology; having a master plan to deploy a thought through programme of activities and work throughout the year and ensure that meetings have a clearly defined purpose, as opposed to a directionless talking shop.

In Westgate the idea of a Youth Council is new and fresh. There are definitive stages of development from the inaugural meeting of interested persons. To develop a firmly established group to the emergence of a truly sustainable organisation, in its own right. This involves intensive working with young people, the group will need to receive induction training to include team building, meeting, communication skills and so on. Realistically to physically deliver this in a comprehensive and effective way Westgate has a need for a full-time vouth professional. It is highly unlikely that this would be funded from the council tax budget but would look toward securing external funding, which has been very difficult to secure in recent times, as for the last year huge chunks of money normally ear marked for community projects have been diverted to assist the effort to combat the covid pandemic. This bid would initially be a five-year project and would link into Westgate Town Councils other ambitions with the newly acquired Lymington Road recreation ground and a Community Interest Company to manage such initiatives.

It is early days, but there is a new sense of optimism as we emerge from the gloom of the covid pandemic.

The legal transfer documents were signed in the office.

This is a great opportunity for the community of Westgate-on-Sea to learn and appreciate the benefits of community ownership and shape the future of the sites. We aim to encourage local people of all ages, abilities and interests to come along and get involved. This is an amazing opportunity to strengthen community cohesion and to promote sustainable living and learn new skills.

Rob Large, Director of Property Asset Management at Thanet District Council stated "We have worked closely with Westgate Town Council to enable this Community Asset Transfer to take place and are grateful to them for their positive input to ensure the transfer went through as smoothly as possible. We're very much looking forward to seeing how the community come together to shape the future use of the site for years to come."



Of course, with ownership comes responsibility and the Town Council would like to invite volunteers in the community to contact us as we want to undertake some immediate renovation works to enable the changing rooms to be utilised in time for football matches which are planned during the summer.

The Town Council will be carrying out consultation opportunities later in the summer and would urge all residents to get involved; the draft proposals for the site are hoped to enhance the landscape, improve biodiversity and renovate the facilities.

Vision Zero

What is Vision Zero?

This comes out of an International perspective on Vehicle and Road Safety. World leaders held a conference to address this. The result was the Stockholm Declaration 2020 which requires 50% reduction in fatalities by 2030 and to reach 0 (zero) by 2050.

The overall agreement is for safe systems and working towards the targets to achieve this. It was agreed that traffic deaths are preventable. The transport network is seen as a 'system' and there is a need to re-design the 'system' to protect users of roads and streets. The UK government is working in-line with this.

Consequently, Kent County Council is in-line with the UK government and is working to create a Safe System Approach. The busiest parts of the UK are in Kent - higher than some Metropolitan areas. The current strategy needs renewing and KCC are working to provide a framework for this vision and ambition for the future on our roads.

KCC are promoting the Vision Zero initiative on road safety and recently held a public consultation to get responses and feedback from Kent residents.

- · Aim is for zero fatalities by 2050
- Belief is that traffic deaths are preventable
- Zero is the only justifiable fatality target for road traffic
- This initiative will be proactive to identify risks and take steps to prevent fatal injuries
- Aim to design a system that protects ALL people
 - 1. Develop a solution that takes into account that people make mistakes
 - 2. Safe Roads and Streets
 - 3. Safe Speeds
 - 4. Safe Behaviours
 - 5. Safe Vehicles
 - 6. Post-Collision Response/Support Victims
 - 7. Be proactive not just reactive
- ALL means drivers of all types of vehicle, including farm vehicles; all pedestrians; cyclists; horse riders; dog walkers; runners/joggers etc reflecting safety on all roads in Kent wherever you live and work - not just on busy roads and motorways - but in all towns and villages including the rural areas.
- KCC, together with Kent Police, will be proactive in engaging with communities to research and pilot new innovative approaches

- The primary approach will be through engaging with communities and inviting participation in the decision-making process because road safety is a shared responsibility between road users, local community and highway authority.
- The aim is to change the culture of road users and achieve safer behaviours, habits and circumstances so that people can feel safe and have a good quality of life.

Westgate Town Council are happy to hear from you if you have any ideas or suggestions that will address local road safety issues. We can share these with our Kent County Councillors and County Highways Authority.

An important part of this is our own local Speedwatch Group. Now that Covid restrictions are lifting, this group is going out again to parts of our town to address speeding and act as a reminder to drivers to drive safely and within speed limits.

This group also needs the support of volunteers. So please get in touch if you have an hour to spare and can help us. Stay safe!

Annual Town Meeting v Statutory Annual Town **Council Meeting**

This is a very busy period of the year for Local Councils, there are two quite different meetings that must be held at this time.

Firstly, the Council needs to hold an annual statutory meeting to carry out those things that only need doing once a year. These include:

- · Electing a Chairman
- · Electing a Vice-Chairman (if the council wants to have one)
- Appointing committees

The Town Council held this on Zoom on Tuesday 4th May 2021 and Cllr Joanna Cornford was elected to continue as Chairman for 2021/22. The Committee membership was decided and the Town Council has resolved for the following committees for 2021/22 -

Finance & General Purposes Committee

- Planning, Highways & Environment Committee
- Human Resources Committee

Events, Tourism & Developments Sub-Committee of F&GP Committee

There are other Steering Groups and Working Groups as required. The draft minutes for this meeting can be found on the Town Council website. The video recording can be found here https://www.westgateonsea.gov.uk/community/ westgate-on-sea-town-council-13327/fullcouncil-2021/

Secondly, there is the Annual Town or Parish Meeting. This is, in legal terms, a quite separate body from the Council, but it is invariably the Council that arranges it (simply because it is unlikely that anyone else will do so). Its decisions are not binding on the Council, though a wise Council will normally want to take heed of what is said at the meeting. It may help you to remember the difference between the two meetings if I explain that the Annual Parish Meeting is a legacy from the Middle Ages, when Local Councils did not exist, and all local decision making was carried out by meetings of the whole community, taking place in the church vestry. The Annual Town Meeting is open to all electors of our Town, who have the right not only to attend but also to speak on any matter of local interest.

This is in contrast to a Council meeting, where electors who are not Councillors have no automatic right to speak (though many councils do, of course, have a set time before, during or after the Council meeting when electors can raise matters of concern to them). This meeting has its own minutes, which should be kept separately from the Council minutes,

and these minutes can only be approved by the next Annual Town Meeting which will, of course, not be held until the following year.

The Annual Town Meeting must be held each year between March 1st and June 1st. The Town Council arranged and held the Annual Town Meeting this year on Zoom on 22nd April 2021 and the video recording can be found here - https://www.westgateonsea. gov.uk/community/westgate-on-sea-towncouncil-13327/annual-town-meeting/

The Annual Town Meeting lasted two hours and was informative and engaging, the quest speakers included Steve from Changing Minds CIC, Peter the Tree/Biodiversity Warden for Westgate and Mark the PCSO for Westgate.

This was the first year that the Town Council held Community Star Awards and in conjunction with Kent Association of Local Councils. Kent County Council and the High Sheriff of Kent awarded two volunteers in the community recognition for their contributions. There is a separate article for this part of the meeting in this issue, congratulations to all those awarded, well deserved.

View from the Chair

Welcome to our 9th issue of the Town Council magazine.

Last month we hosted the first ever 'Westgate-on-Sea Virtual Town Meeting', our Clerk has written an interesting article on parish and town council annual meetings. At the Annual Town Council Meeting councillors vote for their Chairman and Vice Chairman. The term' Chairman' is not only historic it is prescribed within the legislation of the Local Government Act 1972 and is frequently truncated to 'Chair, as you will see.

This year most of my colleagues voted for me to continue as Chairman, and I would like to thank the Clerk for her dedicated and hugely supportive work as Town Clerk, Responsible Financial Officer (RFO) and a resident of Westgate-on-Sea. Without Gill's organised, reliable approach and inspirationally positive attitude, the Chairman's job would be a vastly different one. I also thank council Members for the time and effort they all put into the role they have taken on as Town Councillors. Some ot these roles involve Chairing committees, voting on the committee Chairs is carried out at the individual committee meetings. This year the council Chairman is also Chairman of Human Resources (HR, formerly 'Personnel') with Cllr David Donaldson as Vice Chair, Planning, Highways & Environment (PH&E) Chairman is naturally Cllr Dr Hannah Scott with Cllr Helen Page as her Vice Chair. The Finance & General Purposes committee has not convened; however, Cllr Pauline O'Connor was re-appointed as Councillor Auditor to complement the internal audit process.

Earlier this year it was proposed to establish an Events, Tourism & Developments sub-committee, we hope this will attract residents, as non-members, willing to share their experience and skills to build a dedicated group, focused on promoting our town by staging events, such as the Scarecrow Festival (now an annual fixture) and developing the assets of the town, from May 2021 these include the Memorial Recreation Ground on Lymington Road.

In addition to our own election of Chairmen; on the 6th of May 2021 there were elections for District and County Councillors. Our District Councillors remain the same, but at Kent County level we congratulate Cllr Derek Crow-Brown and Cllr Linda Wright as the new KCC Councillors representing Westgate-on-Sea, which comes under the banner of 'Birchington and Rural'. Both councillors have already been in contact, and we look forward to an effective working relationship, benefitting both the Westgate Ward and Thanet as a whole (a Ward is a geographical area designated as a civil parish, district, or other, for electoral purposes).

Working together is invaluable, a recent example is the Parish Conference call, instigated by the District Council during the first lockdown of the pandemic. These calls have proved beneficial and will continue into the foreseeable future, providing significant information sharing via Zoom and telephone, allowing parishes and towns to make their needs known directly to the District.

Another information hub for parish and towns is the

> long-standing Thanet Area Committee (TAC) the experienced Chairman of Birchington Parish Council is the present Chair of TAC. Every parish and town council votes to select two council members to attend these meetings. TAC members share expertise and work behind the scenes to achieve the best possible outcomes for concerns affecting Thanet's communities. The current focus for the group are the controversial planning applications, if we are to have new homes built the goal is to secure what is necessary, affordable, and suitable for our demographic, whilst at the same time safeguarding the assets of the area by enhancing and not destroying the existing wide open spaces, and accessible shorelines which make it so attractive to visitors and tourists, together with the abundant heritage, and the centuries of highly productive farming on the Isle of Thanet.

On the lighter side, life as a councillor is not all responsibility, legislation, and meetings to enable improvements, it can be fun and social improvements are created by both councillors and residents achieving together. Since the May magazine we have attracted a small increase in the number of volunteers for Westgate in Bloom (WiB) and the Great British Clean Up. Over the second May 2021 Bank Holiday weekend, WiB volunteers worked at installing tree guards and re-mulching the base of the young trees on Lymington Green, these have suffered vandalism and the enthusiastic attention of dogs. The Great British Clean Up volunteers removed multiple bags of general litter from West Bay and St. Mildred's Bay and during the first weekend in June there will be another assault on the litter within the town and on the south side of Westgate-on-Sea. The town council cannot over stress the need for residents to contact their landlords if they do not have refuse bin provision, if the landlord is not contactable then please get in touch with the town council officers. The street bins are for street rubbish and filling them with domestic waste only increases overspill, which is not only unsightly but unpleasant for those who clear it up.

Working together has very recently seen the planning of an event at the Community Centre on the 18thJuly 2021 when the Town Council, the Heritage Centre and the Action Group Against Housing Development will be undertaking something along the lines of a joint event, watch this space and believe that communities together can make a difference.



Rubbish and Recycling

I know we have lots of responsible residents and traders who dispose of their waste in the correct manner but equally we still have individuals who are blighting our area with discarded packaging, mixing domestic refuse in communal bins, fly tipping and litter.

We have the Great British Spring Clean period approaching and therefore I wanted to highlight some of the problems and hopefully advise on the issues that some people through volunteering are tackling to help improve our environment in the community.

The Town Council operates a top up cleansing service and we have additional public litter bins in various areas of the Town. We empty these at least three days a week and in peak season more often dependent on their location. We are still experiencing domestic waste being deposited in public litter bins, particularly in the centre of Town. This causes a few issues, firstly the bins are overflowing, sometimes within hours and secondly the seagulls do like to dive in and pull-out bags which can sometimes contain discarded food. dirty nappies and even used sanitary products! If you live in a property you should have your own means of domestic waste disposal, if you are a resident in a flat please contact your landlord or Thanet District Council to get advice for how this can be achieved and managed.

If you are a trader or business then you should have trade waste provision in place, it is not acceptable to deposit trade waste in a public litter bin. Thanet District Council do operate a cost effective commercial waste service – further details can be obtained by email – commercialwaste@thanet.gov.uk or visit the TDC website - https://www.thanet.gov.uk/infopages/commercial-waste-service/

Fly-tipping is a criminal offence and is a constant draw on resources for the Town Council and Thanet District Council. Thanet District Council website has a reporting tool you can use but please be aware that the cleaning or maintenance of private land or unadopted alleyways are the responsibility of the private landowner. We all need to play our part in keeping our Town clean and tidy, please dispose of your rubbish responsibly. There are a vast range of services



online that Thanet District Council have for Waste and Recycling -

- Request a service either online or by telephone for bulky waste collection, assisted collection, clinical waste collection or garden waste collection.

If you have large communal recycling and refuse bins please ensure that the correct items are deposited as mixing refuse can result in bins being left and this causes distress for elderly residents and those who want to keep a clean and tidy area where they live. There are also of course Freegle and other organisations where you can advertise free items and our local Charity Shops are now beginning to open again so we can all recycle unwanted items and support a good cause at the same time.

Consultation for Litter Bins / Grit Bins

The Town Council has allocated funds from the capital project budget this year (2021/22) to meet the cost of additional litter bins and grit bins for Westgate.

There are proposals for additional grit bins to be purchased and installed and the locations will need to be agreed with Kent County Council. The Town Council is keen to hear from residents with suggested locations, if you live near a road/ area that is particularly prone to ice/snow please do get in touch. As the Town Council has now completed the Community Asset Transfer for the War Memorial Recreation Ground we are looking at the litter bin provision in the site. There is one plastic litter bin that has sadly been vandalised so it is proposed to replace this with a metal bin instead.

There does appear to be enough litter bins inside the play area and one in the skate park area. Therefore, it is proposed to have one additional litter bin placed on site for general litter and dog waste use. We would appreciate your feedback on our proposals for the site in relation to litter/dog waste bin provision.

Tree Wardens and the Tree Council

In the winter of 2021 Westgate Town Council set about recruiting a Tree Warden. By the spring they had recruited volunteer Peter Hasted, a Kent Tree and Pond Warden, who committed to ten hours a month to help ensure the conservation and maintenance of trees and shrubs on public land in the town of Westgate on Sea while encouraging biodiversity by educating the community with the support of the Town Council.

The Tree Council launched the Tree Warden Scheme in 1990 and co-ordinates the Scheme nationally. It works with local authorities, voluntary organisations, parish councils and local partnerships to set up and develop Tree Warden - networks in towns, cities and the countryside.

As local tree champions, Tree Wardens are the eyes and ears of their neighbourhoods, with community involvement being a central aim of the Scheme. Tree Wardens are encouraged to work with local schools and other youth groups, developing imaginative projects to encourage others to value the community's trees and woods. Involving children and youths in such projects has been proven to reduce vandalism.

To encourage local residents to endorse trees, Peter is Planning to lead guided tree walks around different parts of the town and will be promoting The Tree Council's 'National Tree Week', usually held during the last week on November - the best time to be planting trees.

Tree Wardens plant, protect and promote their local trees. No training or experience in tree management is needed – just a love of trees and a few hours to spare. So, if you would like to get involved please contact Peter via the Town Clerk.

Westgate's Tree Canopy

In a recent citizen science project hosted by Brillianto, Forest Research and Trees For Cities, Thanet's tree canopy was put at 10.8%, much higher than a previous Greenpeace study which put Thanet at a miserable 4.4%, one of the lowest tree canopy coverages in the whole of the UK.

While Thanet's tree canopy remains lower than the national average (between 13% and 16% depending on the source of the information), it is actually slightly higher than the national average for urban coastal zones which is currently at 10.4%.



However, if you look at the coverage in Thanet broken down into the district's wards, and look closer to home, we find that for Westgate on Sea the canopy is a meagre 6.8%.

This shocking revelation highlights the need not only to plant more trees in Westgate, but to also to protect the local tree stock from any further unnecessary decline.

Tree Charter

Before modern inks had been developed, all documents were written in Oak gall ink. Oak galls are produced when the oak gall wasp lays its egg on developing seed and, instead of an acorn being formed, it forms hard, round gall. The galls are crushed and consigned to being steeped in water so the dye leaches out, before being mixed with ferrous sulphate creating the ink that wrote such documents as the Magna Carter 1215 and subsequently the Charter of the Forest 1217.

The Tree Charter was launched in Lincoln Castle on 6 November 2017 on the 800th anniversary of the 1217 Charter of the Forest. The Charter for Trees, Woods and People sets out the 12 principles for a society in which people and trees can stand stronger together, which would be great for Westgate to adopt in a bid to help protect our trees.

This year they recognise those who went above and beyond supporting residents who were shielding during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Lorraine and Richard Hambidge

Lorraine and Richard both volunteer individually and together for the Town. They both had the idea for the first ever Scarecrow Festival for the Town last year in July. Richard kindly helped to reset the computers donated to the Computers for School scheme. He also helped to weed, dig and plant for a number of Westgate in Bloom Project sites. 


