

5 July 1948 was an historic moment in our country's history. It was the day the National Health Service (NHS) was born, bringing free health care to everyone.

The NHS has been treasured ever since, and never more so than during the Coronavirus pandemic which has affected us all and changed all our lives.

The first NHS. Social Care and Frontline Workers' Day took place on 5 July 2021. The event was recognition of the work of NHS staff and all critical workers who kept shops open and stocked. streets safe and essential services running.

The day was generously supported by national organisations including English Heritage, the Daily Express, NHS Charities Together and the WI.

A series of events took place involving every aspect of society and raising money for NHS Charities Together, which supports 250 hospitals and their charitable trusts, and the National Care Association which represents 1.6 million workers caring for some of society's frailest citizens.

Westgate Town Council was proud to support this nationwide event and show appreciation for everything NHS staff and all key workers do for our country.

Local Church representatives, Town Councillors and residents met at the Flagpole on Sea Road Memorial Gardens for the hoisting of the NHS, Social Care & Frontline Workers' Day Flag at 10am.

At 11am a 2-minute silence was observed. followed by a short service.

Rotary Club – Hope for Tomorrow

The Rotary Club of Westgate & Birchington has been very busy recently, undertaking two important projects. We are supporting the charity "Hope for Tomorrow" which provides mobile cancer care to patients who have difficulties attending for chemotherapy at the hospitals in East Kent which are widely spaced apart. The Mobile Cancer Care Unit (named "Caron", after Caron Keating) has been undergoing renovation and we wanted to help with the funding of this important vehicle.

During June and July, we organised a textile recycling collection and were delighted to receive over 200 black sacks of clothing and bedding from kind donors in Westgate and Birchington. The bags weighed in at well over a tonne (1143.7 Kg to be precise) and will be converted into a donation of about £285 for Hope for Tomorrow (more than enough to fund a day's work in "Caron". Over the coming year, we will continue to raise funds for this excellent charity.

Our second project was to give support to a long-standing friend of our club who garages our "Santa's Sleigh" (which tours the streets of Westgate and Birchington each Christmas, so that children can meet Santa and help us to raise funds for local charities). Her very large garden had become extremely overgrown during the recent hot and wet weather and so a working party of Rotarians descended with their shears and clippers to restore the garden to its former glory.

Our Rotary Club enjoys excellent fellowship, participates in a wide variety of fund-raising projects. Supports civic and community

Update on War Memorial Recreation Ground

The War Memorial Recreation Ground on Lymington Road is gradually being prepared for the coming football season and the initial preparation to get the Changing Rooms ready for football matches is underway.

The changing room is being upgraded and we have already removed the old water tank and carried out subsequent repairs with new plumbing work scheduled for improved shower and toilet facilities. We are making good progress and the regular grass cutting, carried out by a local contractor, began in June with pitch marking organised for early autumn when we aim to start hosting football matches by the end of September.

There is still a lot to achieve at the recently transferred asset of the War Memorial Recreation Ground; it is a huge open space which was dedicated to the people of Westgate on Sea and provides so much opportunity, not only the return of an operational football pitch alongside a netball court and skate park area, but also a wonderful time for everyone in the community to share their skills and engage with both the town council and other residents to achieve the best use of this lovely gift from a thoughtful resident many decades ago in 1914.

Westgate-on-Sea Town Council Small Grants Scheme

The Westgate-on-Sea Town Council Small Grants Scheme has been running since the Council was formed in 2015.

The Grant Scheme gives not for profit community groups and organisations the opportunity to apply for a sum of up to £500 for projects or events which will benefit the Westgate-on-Sea community.

Westgate-on-Sea Town Council wishes to encourage and support a diverse range of high quality, innovative and ambitious events and projects that engage local residents and visitors alike. Previously grants have been awarded to the Westgate-on-Sea Cricket Club, Scout Group, WAR (Westgate Against Rubbish) and the Westgate-on-Sea Lighting and Improvements Committee.

Westgate-on-Sea Scout Group - Testimony "Money donated to our Scout Group has been used to purchase an event shelter and flag.

They will help us raise the profile of the group. advertise the movement, promote the sections at events and provide weather cover whilst at camps."

There are two rounds of funding available, with applications being accepted in April and October of each year. The amount of money available is set annually in the budget of the Council. grants will normally be up to a maximum of £500, although higher amounts will be considered in exceptional circumstances. All applications are reviewed by an elected panel at the Finance and General Purposes Committee Meeting.

New Post Office At Station Superstore

The new post office in Westgate opened for business on the 28th July in the shop right opposite the railway station called "The Station Superstore", which is at 49 Station Road.

The proprietor, Sangay Sangeethi has been working on this with Post Office since July 2020 when he discovered that the existing post office in Paydens the Chemist was scheduled to close. Sangay and his team in the shop have been through an extensive course and intense training with Post Office and Sangay is a little proud at being a fully qualified Postmaster.

In the interim the current post office counter is a temporary one. But a permanent and larger counter service will be fitted, this is planned for the middle of October (see opening times below). There is a significant demand for postal services in Westgate which is the only counter financial services left in the town. Not that long ago Westgate boasted three high street bank branches; NatWest, Lloyds and Barclays. The post office is a crucial and needed service for the residents of Westgate.

At the moment there is not an external post box, but one inside the shop that is open from 6am to 11pm seven days a week. The shop is always well stocked with groceries and an off licence with a formidable supply of wines, beers and spirits.

David Donaldson of Westgate on Sea Town council has been quietly supporting and championing this initiative with Sangay through the lockdowns. The Town Council has been in constant contact with the Network Provision team at Post Office and supported the robust process to seek a solution for the town.

Bench & Memorial Makeovers

Residents may already have noticed that the wooden bench outside St Saviours Church has recently benefitted from a facelift.

Mike Wiseman and Alan Richards are the volunteer team responsible for the makeover, and they are working tirelessly to improve benches and other areas of Westgate, including the Ingram Memorial.

Sir William Ingram lived at The Bungalow, Westgate-on-Sea, from 1887 to 1924. In 1926 one of his sons, Sir Herbert Ingram, asked permission from the then Westgate-on-Sea Parish Council to erect a memorial to his parents at the corner of the Bungalow grounds.

The Bungalow subsequently became the Rowena Court Hotel and, when the hotel was sold and demolished, the memorial became neglected. Although it was cleaned by local residents during the 1990s, unfortunately the Latin inscription has since become completely illegible. The inscription reads:

IN MEMORY OF WHI (WILLIAM HENRY INGRAM) AND MECI (MARY ELIZA COLLINGWOOD INGRAM) HUSBAND AND WIFE

THEY LIVED CLOSE TO THIS PLACE, WHERE THEY HAD MANY BENEFICIAL MEMORIES

THIS MEMORIAL IS PLACED BY THEIR THREE SONS

1925

It is wonderful to see our local heritage being preserved and restored and our sincere thanks to Mike and Alan for the work they are undertaking which looks absolutely fantastic!



Inspections and Working Group Meeting

At the beginning of August the Town Council along with the Site Representatives walked around the allotments completing the second site inspection this year. The Allotments were looking great, with lots of fantastic vegetables and fruit ready to be picked. It was great to see how much, even the newest plot holders, had achieved. The Allotment Working Group met in August 2021 for the second meeting of the year.

St Crispin's School Visit

The children invited all those who had hosted the day, to come and view the display they had made about the trip. The display included artwork and details about the allotments and how food grows. It really showed how much the children had learnt and had clearly enjoyed the trip.



Westgate Draft Neighbourhood Plan Update

Westgate-on-Sea Town
Council and the residents

The Westgate-on-Sea Neighbourhood Plan (NP) is a new kind of planning document.

It is part of the Government's approach to planning which aims to give local communities more influence in their neighbourhood's development. This NP has been produced by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG), and a sub-committee of the Westgate-on-Sea Town Council, chaired by Cllr Dr Hannah Scott and formed of Town Councillors and community members. A number of Garlinge residents have also been members of the group, as the housing allocation in the TDC Local Plan called "Westgate" spans both Westgate-on-Sea and Garlinge and greatly affects both areas. The NP has been prepared through consultation with residents through the feedback at the initial meeting.

The Town Council is now progressing the Westgate Neighbourhood Plan to the Regulation 14 Consultation as per The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 which will be launched in September 2021. There will be an 8-week period for consultation and we are pleased to be working with Goldstone Town Planning and Breakthrough Communications who will provide a digital formal survey, virtual consultation events and the Town Council will host two face to face consultation events one at the Westgate on Sea Community Centre on Lyminaton Road and the second at the Christ Church URC on Westgate Bay Avenue. Details of the consultation with dates and times will be available on our website, Facebook page and we will deliver a leaflet to households as well to mark the consultation launch.

There will be printed copies of the draft Westgate Neighbourhood Plan about the town and a few copies available at the Town Council office if anyone wants to visit to read the document. We are open Monday to Thursday from 10am until 12.30pm.

We urge you to get involved and comment on the draft document, it is our town and very important that everyone has an opportunity to input and feedback on the proposed draft NP. If you have any queries please contact Gill Gray the Town Clerk by email townclerk@westgateonesa.gov.uk.

Westgate in Bloom 2021

South & South East in Bloom is part of Britain in Bloom and runs annual competitions all over Kent.

Entrants include Villages, Parishes, Cities, Coastal Towns. Urban Communities and more. Each community entrant will be visited by an assessor/judge and awards are given in recognition of their achievements.

People presume that Britain in Bloom is all about pretty floral displays, but this is not the case anymore, the environment and community involvement are also big factors.

Entry 1 - Planters on Cambourne Avenue

The planters on Cambourne Avenue were provided by the Westgate-on-Sea Community Spirit Craft Group. The planters were made from salvaged/recycled wooden pallets by one of the Community Spirit Craft group volunteers and the flowers are cared for by the staff of the Fish Inn.





Entry 2 - Lymington Road Allotment Gardens

Set up in the 1920s the allotments were small areas of land leased to residents for the purpose of growing food. Westgate-on-Sea Town Council took over the management of the allotments from Thanet District Council when it was formed in 2015. The Town Council set up, and the Allotment Association help to manage, a community plot. This plot is used to grow and nurture trees and plants which go on to be planted in the community. Earlier this Year the children from St Crispins Infant School visited the Community Plot as part of their topic on growing food.

Entry 3 - Lymington Road Green (Community Centre)

In early 2020 two new flower beds were created on Lymington Green in conjunction with Thanet District Council. In early April volunteers gave up their time to prepare the beds ready for sowing wild meadow seeds. Jump forward to June and we were awash with beautiful Wildflowers. Not only have the flowers been a hit with residents but also with pollinators such as bees and butterflies. Wildflowers grown included native cornfield annuals like corncockles, corn marigolds, poppies etc. Also planted were bluebells and snowdrops. We look forward to seeing them early 2022.





Benches

The Town Council was pleased when it had two picnic tables installed on the green near the Community Centre on Lymington Road. They are designed to allow wheelchair users and pushchairs to be placed in between seats, giving everyone access to sit at the tables and enjoy the views.

Trees

In late 2019 twenty-one saplings were planted out on Lymington Green. The trees were kindly donated by the Woodland Trust and Ovo Energy. These trees have now been adopted by members of the community who keep them watered. Just recently in May 2021 volunteers, with the guidance of Peter Hasted, the Westgate-on-Sea Volunteer Tree Warden and Biodiversity Officer, built new tree cages to help protect the growing trees.





Entry 4 - Sea Road Gardens

Working in collaboration with Thanet District Council we wanted to make interesting flower beds. The planting helped to increase the biodiversity of the area and ensured that there was something interesting to



admire throughout the year. These beds are looked after by a small team of volunteers who gave up time last summer to plant out and water. Volunteers kindly installed small perch benches on the lower part of the gardens so that visitors could sit and rest along the way. The memorial gardens also looked beautiful as two banks were planted with Wildflowers and the roses are now starting to grow around and up the two metal obelisks installed in early 2020. There has also been some remedial works taking place in support of Westgate in Bloom such as the repairing of shelters and creating safer slope access.

Entry 5 - Westgate-on-Sea Train Station

The Town Council has been working closely with it volunteers and the Bumble Bee Conserva-tion Trust to make pollinator friendly flower beds at the Train Station. The plants were spon-sored by the Bumble Bee Conservation Trust and they



also provided tools and equipment for the volunteers to continue to tend the beds. Southeast Rail have also been a huge support and provided access and use of an empty room for storing equipment. There are also lots of herbs planted which as well create more interest for commuters. The creation of the raised beds was funded by Network Rail when the train station had a new footbridge installed. We added wall flowers last year and these provided a beautiful display in the spring; we have commenced works on a raised bed on the opposite platform and this will be a project for the autumn this year.

Entry 6 - Station Road, Cuthbert Road and St Mildreds Road

We have historically had some planters in the Town and these have been added to this year to include Cuthbert Road. They are maintained and watered by local businesses and are a focal point



providing much needed colour and interest for shoppers. The plants are sourced from various local nurseries and grown from seeds by some volunteers. The watering is mostly from rainwater that has been harvested and we use pollinator friendly plants where possible.



The Thanet Big Sing Community Choir

In early 2011, an Open Call went out across Thanet for 100 singers from any musical background to form a choir to sing an exciting, challenging piece of new music to celebrate the opening of Turner Contemporary, Margate. The 'Big Sing Community Choir', led by Music Director, Tony Castro, gave the World Premiere of Orlando Gough's "The Red Volcano" (inspired by JMW Turner's eponymous poem and painting) at the opening of Turner Contemporary Gallery on 17th of April 2011, accompanied by an orchestra of local musicians and students.

Following this debut performance, the singers unanimously agreed to stay together and formed the Thanet Big Sing Community Choir, becoming Turner Contemporary's resident choir and the only choir in the UK based in an art gallery of international standing.

The Thanet Big Sing has gone from strength to strength, performing at the Turner Contemporary (including five world premieres to date), giving regular concerts in Westgate, Broadstairs, and Ramsgate, participating in local festivals and community events and collaborating with other artists. musicians and actors.

The choir has performed at Proms in the Park, the Dickens festival, and at London's SouthBank Centre and supported East Kent Mencap with their Christmas sing-along, together with an annual Christmas event at Turner Contemporary.

Rehearsals take place in Westgate-on-Sea every Tuesday evening during term time from 7.30 to 9.30pm, under the expert guidance of our Music Director, Tony Castro, who has had many years in the music industry working on numerous internationally famous shows including productions

of Phantom of the Opera, Rocky Horror Show, Spamalot, Miss Saigon and a great deal more.

We are an inclusive choir, open to anyone who wants to sing with others in a friendly and fun atmosphere, and we welcome all new members aged 18 years and over. You do not need to audition, and choir members do not need to be able to read music or have any previous experience. All you need is enthusiasm and the desire to sing with other like-minded singers. We offer all potential new members a free-of-charge 'taster' rehearsal.

We sing a wide variety of music, including popular, light classical, musical theatre, and folk songs. The Thanet Big Sing regularly commissions new compositions for the choir to compliment and be performed alongside exhibitions at Turner Contemporary and local events. Examples of these, all written and composed by Tony Castro, include On the Tram (T.S. Eliot exhibition), Oh! I do like to be (Seaside Photographed), and our latest piece, Lost and Found (Ellen Harvey exhibition). Often accompanied by other musicians, a narrator, and projected images, these performances are very special and hugely popular.

The Thanet Big Sing Community Choir is well known for being a friendly and supportive choir and a warm welcome awaits anyone joining. Our guiding principle is to have fun while rehearsing and performing mustic that we enjoy singing, relishing the challenge that this sometime presents, but always singing confidently together in a safe, friendly atmosphere. Several social events are planned throughout the year.

I am pleased to report that the Town Council's Neighbourhood Development Plan is nearing finalisation. It is proposed that a consultation meeting with residents will be held in September at the Community Centre. Full details of this meeting will be advertised and distributed shortly.

Cllr David Donaldson has written an article on the Post Office saga. Alongside the Town Clerk, Cllr Donaldson was influential in securing the new location. The new location is guite different, just as friendly but a big change for most of us. I am sure that everyone will be as supportive of the new system.

In contrast to the positive news regarding the Post Office, the last few weeks have seen the dismantlement of the WWI War Memorial plaque at the Lymington Road Recreation Ground following wilful vandalism which resulted in fracturing of the brick wall that supported the slate memorial plaque. The damage to the brick wall meant that it was dangerous - particularly to children using the play area there.

The plaque, with its carefully chosen words. was not damaged and has been removed to a secure location pending the construction of a replacement wall by the Town Council. The provision of the plaque was the idea of the late Dr Dawn Crouch ably assisted by fellow members of the Westgate Heritage Centre and well supported by the Town Clerk, Much 'sweat and tears' went into organising the initiative which culminated in the unveiling of the memorial plague 100 years after the Armistice which ended the Great War in 1918.

This year's Sunflower competition is awaiting judging and the results will be announced in the next issue of the Magazine.

Westgate on Sea Community Centre Association (WOSCCA) Annual General Meeting.

The Westgate Community Centre held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) on the 30th of June 2021. This was the first since 2019 as the scheduled 2020 Annual General Meeting had to be cancelled due to the COVID pandemic. The AGM was not as well attended as usual. as we believe that people are still reticent about attending public gatherings as a result of the pandemic restrictions. But both Joanna Cornford and David Donaldson were present to represent Westgate on Sea Town Council in its continued support for the centre and all the good and hard work done by everyone involved especially Sue Midgley and Bronwen Wood, who are trustee, whose dedication is particularly outstanding. The other trustees of the Community Centre are: Ray Clay, John Skidmore, and Pat Robson.

Even though the pandemic was a disaster, in that the centre had to close; the Centre made it into an opportunity to carry out quite extensive maintenance and upgrading work, ready to "hit the ground running" for the reopening. Both the lobby and meeting room were completely painted as well as the building exterior which was recoated by the Caretaker Andrew. The cladding was replaced on the rear wall and fire door exit bars were fitted and a whole variety of smaller jobs. In addition, 24 new chairs were purchased, sadly four have gone missing. However, if the so and so who "borrowed" them, were to return them, nothing will be said and no questions will be asked. Please, just return them!

In terms of finances, the centre made a loss of just under £12,400. This was obviously due to the closure, during which insurance, electricity, phone, music licence, bin waste collections still had to be paid for. Enterprisingly, the centre managed to secure a small business grant from the Governments Pandemic support scheme administered by Thanet District Council of £10,000. So, the net loss was only slightly over £2.300. In addition, the Treasurer also reported that a second business support grant has been applied for.

The accounts for the Centre are complete. certified and will be filed with the Charities Commission.


