Westgate Draft Neighbourhood Plan Update 2021

The Westgate-on-Sea Neighbourhood Plan (NP) is a new kind of planning document. It is part of the Government's approach to planning which aims to give local communities more influence in their neighbourhood's development.

This NP has been produced by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG), a sub-committee of the Westgate-on-Sea Town Council, chaired by Cllr Dr Hannah Scott and formed of Town Councillors and community members. The NP has been prepared through consultation with residents utilising the feedback at the initial meeting.

Westgate-on-Sea Town Council and the residents of Westgate want to protect and enhance the town for the benefit of present and future generations. We hope that this Westgate Neighbourhood Plan will help to fulfil this aim.

This is the first opportunity to comment on the draft document and the feedback will be used to revisit the plan before it progresses to Thanet District Council for the next stage. The NP will then undergo independent examination before finally going to a local referendum. If the NP is passed at a local referendum it will then be 'made' by Thanet District Council and will become part of the Development Plan alongside the TDC Local Plan.

The NP outlines the proposed vision and objectives for the town and is split into eight themes which the survey uses to seek your views on individual aspects of the draft NP. The themes are design, economy, heritage, sustainability, green space, biodiversity and facilities.

Each theme is supported by proposed planning policies and which are holistically grouped. Section 18 of the draft NP then contains details of the Community Actions which are strategies for managing other important aspects of the town that are not under planning law.

The Town Council is now progressing the Westgate Neighbourhood Plan to the Regulation 14 Consultation as per The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 which was launched on 24th September 2021. There is an 8-week period for consultation which ends on 19th November 2021 at 5pm; we are pleased to be working with Goldstone Town Planning and Breakthrough Communications who have provided a digital formal survey and virtual consultation events.



The Town Council has hosted two face to face consultation events, one at the Westgate on Sea Community Centre on Lymington Road on Sunday 26th September and the second at the Christ Church URC on Westgate Bay Avenue on Wednesday 29th September. Details of the consultation and survey are available on our website -

- posted on our Facebook page and we have delivered a leaflet to households as well to mark the consultation launch. There are printed copies of the survey available for residents who are not able to access the online version, these can be collected from our office at 78 St Mildreds Road or we can assist you at the office to complete online.

There are printed copies of the draft Westgate Neighbourhood Plan about the town and a few copies available at the Town Council office if anyone wants to visit to read the document. We are open Monday to Thursday from 10am until 12.30pm. If these times are not convenient please do contact us to arrange an appointment outside these hours.

We urge you to get involved and comment on the draft document, it is our town and very important that everyone has an opportunity to input and feedback on the proposed draft NP. Hello, my name is Jan. I am a Neighbourhood Watch and Thanet NW Committee member and have recently joined the WTC monthly Community Clinics to promote the benefits of living in a NW area.

The aim of Neighbourhood Watch is to share advice on how individuals can keep themselves, their home and property as safe as possible. In the event of any crime, this must be reported to the Police. We liaise regularly with them to be kept up to date with relevant crimes that may be happening in the area and this information is then shared out amongst the coordinators, who subsequently inform the homes that are within the scheme and covered by that volunteer.

I have left booklets called 'Stav Safe' in the WTC office; if you wish to call in and collect one outside of the clinic mornings and if you are interested in becoming a volunteer for the scheme, please leave your details with one of the Admin Team at the Town Council and I can forward a registration form. The time commitment is minimal but you do need to be online as that is how information is shared by Kent Police.

Save Our Fields Community Walk - Westgate and Garlinge

On Sunday 3rd October the Westgate and Garlinge Action Group Against Housing led a community walk through the fields surrounding Westgate to raise awareness of the 2,000 new residential units proposed in the planning application by Millwood Designer Homes.

In attendance were Thanet District Councillors Pauline Farrance, Mike Garner, and Matthew Scott, alongside committee members from the action group.

Participants were invited to discuss the planning application and share their concerns. Issues raised included the detrimental impact to the environment (such as pollution and the heightened risk of flooding) as well as pressure on existing infrastructure (increased road traffic and the oversubscription of local services). Another matter highlighted was housing affordability and availability for local residents. The leading concern was the potential loss of Grade One agricultural land, currently producing high-yielding and sustainably grown food crops.

The walk also included stops for discussion at key areas - one being the fifteenth-century Dent-De-Lion gatehouse. As well as reducing the view of this scheduled monument from the public footpath - a route densely populated by diverse wildlife and enjoyed by many people in the community - attendees commented that archaeological history lying beneath the new building sites may be damaged or destroyed.

Beginning at the Westgate Community Centre, the group walked to Minster Road before heading eastwards towards Dent-De-Lion Road. Phases 1-5 of the proposed development were viewed and a further walk is planned to visit Phase 6. Please do join us. Community Connectors

Community Connectors is a new pilot service now available in Westgate-on-Sea.

Part of the Community Warden Service, Community Connectors support people over 65 who are feeling lonely or socially isolated.

Mandy and Karl are the friendly KCC Community Connectors for Westgate. They are highly trained Community Wardens and Health Coaches with a wealth of experience in welfare visits, multiagency working and community safety.

Using Social Prescribing, Mandy and Karl help and support clients to build confidence to reconnect with activities and events in the local area and feel part of the community. They challenge the disconnection, loneliness and isolation that many older people experience and support clients to reconnect, be active and have purpose.

The service is free and confidential and is available for people over the age of 65.

Once a Community Connector has been allocated, there will be up to 12 weeks of oneto-one support to help clients improve their own personal wellbeing.

Mandy says, 'We have been welcomed into Westgate and have started to work with some of Westgate's residents. We have been Community Wardens for 4 years and are currently supporting Westgate as Community Connectors as part of a Pilot funded by Intereg where we are working with people over the age of 65 who live in Westgate-on-sea to help combat social isolation and loneliness and help them build confidence to improve their own health and wellbeing'.

Shoreline's Galleries on the Beautiful Isle of Thanet

Sarah Gibbon and Vivienne Rose are the trading partnership called Shoreline. After both moving to Westbrook Bay, following successful careers at Goldsmiths, University of London for over 30 years, they decided to follow their dreams and set up a creative business together.

They wanted to work with and for local artists, makers and creatives in their new community in Thanet and across Kent. After the creation of a business model that they felt was fair to the artists and would deliver a unique shopping experience they set about looking for premises. Having already established a well-received makers' market (Margate Made) in the previous year, and once the word was out that they were looking, they were approached to lead The Eclectic Art Gallery in Margate's historic Old Town.

Established in 2016 by an artists' collective, The Eclectic Art Gallery has contributed to the development of Margate as a must-see venue for locals, visitors and tourists interested in art and creativity. From 1st September 2019, Sarah and Vivienne have helped the resident group of artists to expand the range of art on sale, to run commercially successful exhibitions and other activities. The gallery's mission is to affordably showcase the talents of Kent-based artists, with regularly changing displays to appeal to everyone. In an intimate space on the ground floor of in the picturesque Crown Chambers building close to the Turner Contemporary Gallery, Eclectic's group exhibit and sell their contemporary original oil, acrylic and watercolour paintings, ceramics, mixed media, jewellery, digital and traditional photography, and textiles. They also sell prints and cards. The gallery is open Wednesdays to Sundays, 11am to 5pm and is a short stroll from the rail station, along the sea front, with car-parking and bus routes nearby.

Still looking for that extra space to offer more local makers and artisans as well as fine artists the opportunity of a supportive and reasonably priced way to exhibit and sell their work, they continued looking across Thanet and viewed a number of commercial properties until finally settling on Westgate-on-Sea. They fell in love with 29 Station Road as soon as they saw the front window, the canopied row of independent shops, and the bright and airy interior which offered the potential for the type of venture they had in mind. There was no precedent in Westgate for this type of independent retail gallery and they felt that this could be an untapped opportunity, on one of Thanet's most thriving high streets. Westgate Galleria opened in November 2019 after receiving an exciting and enthusiastic response from lots of local artists, makers and creatives who wanted to be part of this new venture.

Nearly two years on, and having weathered the special challenges of 2020/21, the Galleria is a popular gallery and gift shop that stocks a wide range of unique and beautifully made original art and artisan-made accessories, products for the home, the collector and for gifting, alongside greetings cards and prints. All work is designed and handmade by independent artists and small creative business owners, offering Shoreline's customers the unique shopping experience that Sarah and Vivienne are proud to invite our readers to enjoy. Parking nearby is free and Westgate's rail station and bus stops are just a few minutes' walk away.

Both galleries host guest exhibitions which change every month. These attract both established artists and those who are new to exhibiting. It is a strength of the business that Sarah and Vivienne take the time and effort to support those who are new to exhibiting and selling, working collaboratively with them to take the stress and worry out of learning how to put on a show early in their artistic careers.

Both gallery spaces are flourishing and are attracting new artists and makers to join their groups every day. Many of Shoreline's artists, makers and creatives were very productive over the lockdowns and there are always interesting new products on display and for sale. Sarah and Vivienne are currently planning for the time they can return to running the Margate Made events, re-opening bookings for the workshop, course and meeting spaces they have created at Westgate Galleria; and also running some further larger scale exhibitions across Thanet that will showcase the work of the artists, makers and creatives they work with. They are currently helping to set up the town's new Business Forum, and are actively involved in the Shop Locally initiative and the local Fiver Fest project.

Talking to Sarah and Vivienne they expressed how much they have enjoyed becoming part of Westgate's community, and the huge satisfaction it gives them to be able to proactively support and encourage the creative population of this wonderful part of Thanet. They are currently working with over 70 artists, makers and creatives from across Kent, including many living in or near Westgate and would welcome anyone who is interested in joining their galleries to contact them for information on their very attractive space rental packages.

Westgate in Bloom Awards 2021

South & South East in Bloom is part of Britain in Bloom and runs annual competitions all over Kent.

This year Westgate in Bloom was proud to submit 6 entries under the Britain in Bloom's – It's your Neighbourhood Category. This campaign focuses on community improvement using gardening and horticulture. Entries are awarded a level of achievement from Level 1 (Establishing) to Level 5 (Outstanding).

On 13th July, Judge Jean Griffin came to Westgateon-Sea where she was given a tour of all the entry sites and met with staff and volunteers who helped support Westgate in Bloom. On 15th September South & South East in Bloom held an online Award Ceremony which was attended by Councillor Joanna Cornford on behalf of Westgate in Bloom.

Entry 1 – Westgate-on-Sea Community Spirit (Planters on Cambourne Avenue)

The planters on Cambourne Avenue made by one of the Community Spirit Craft group volunteers and the flowers which are cared for by the staff of the Fish Inn and Bethany's Café received the Level 3 Award (Advancing).





Entry 2 – Westgate-on-Sea Allotment Association (Lymington Road Allotment Gardens)

The Town Council and the Allotment Association help to manage the Community Plot which is used to grow and nurture trees and plants which go on to be planted in the community as well as hosting visiting school trips. This year the Westgate-on-Sea Allotment Association received a level 4 award (Thriving) for their hard work.



Entry 3 – Westgate-on-Sea Lymington Green (Community Centre)

In 2020 two new Wildflower beds were created on Lymington Green in conjunction with Thanet District Council which were a huge hit with residents and pollinators alike. In addition, accessible picnic benches were installed and 21 trees were planted and protective cages built earning the Lymington Green a Level 4 Award (Thriving).





Entry 4 – Sea Road Gardens

The flower beds on Sea Road are looked after by a small team of volunteers who gave up time last summer to plant out and water. Volunteers also installed small perch benches on the lower part of the gardens so that visitors could sit and rest along the way. In addition, two banks were planted with Wildflowers in the



War Memorial Gardens and some remedial works took place in support of Westgate in Bloom, such as repairing of shelters and creating safer slope access. Thanks to all this hard work Sea Road achieved a Level 4 Award (Thriving).

Entry 5 – Westgate-on-Sea Train Station

With huge support from Southeastern Railway, Network Rail, its volunteers and the Bumble Bee Conservation Trust, Westgate in Bloom, created pollinator friendly flower beds at the Train Station. New wall flowers were added last year and these provided a beautiful display in the spring. The Train



Station was awarded Level 2 (Improving).



Entry 6 – Westgate Business Group (Station Road, Cuthbert Road and St Mildreds Road)

The Town's planters have been added to this year with

a new planter being placed on Cuthbert Road. These are maintained and watered by local businesses. The high street planters were awarded a Level 4 (Thriving).





Recycling at the Town Council

Westgate-on-Sea Town Council, in conjunction with TerraCycle, offers free recycling programmes that collect hard-to-recycle waste. These programmes offered by TerraCycle are funded by brands, manufacturers and retailers to help reduce the amount of waste going to landfill. We currently collect:

Bread Loaf Bags 🏅

The Bread Bag Recycling

Programme recycle your bread loaf bags and turn them into new products such as outdoor benches as well as sheeting and film for the agricultural industry.

Once collected, the bread bags are shredded, washed and then pelletised. These pellets can be used for a number of moulded rigid plastic products.

Walkers Crisps



Every year countless crisp packets end up in landfill sites across the UK. Working with Walkers TerraCycle are preventing this resource from ending up at landfill.

Once collected, the crisp packets are separated by plastic type, cleaned, and extruded into plastic pellets to make new recycled products.

KP Nuts, Popcorn, Crisps and Pretzels

This recycling scheme allows us to recycle any nut, popcorn or pretzel packaging including Hula Hoops, Pombears, Tyrrells and Butterkist. Supermarket own brands are welcome too.

Once collected, the aggregated nuts, popcorn, crisps and pretzels packets are sorted, shredded and washed. The material is then densified into hard-granulated plastic granules. The granules are then extruded so they can be incorporated into the production of different plastic products such as fence posts and benches.



The Pladis Biscuits and Snacks

Recycle your cracker, cake bar and biscuit wrappers. Brands include Carrs, Go Ahead, McVitie, Jacobs and supermarket own brands.

Once collected, the biscuit, cracker and cake wrappers are cleaned and melted into hard plastic that can be remoulded to make new recycled products.



Ring Carriers

Recycle flexible ring carriers keeping them out of landfill. All flexible plastic ring carriers used to hold cans are accepted.

Please note plastic outer packaging is not accepted.

Once collected, the ring carriers are shredded, washed and then pelletised. These pellets can be used for a number of moulded rigid plastic products like benches, or used as film for products such as rubbish bags.

TerraCycle Points System

By partnering with TerraCycle, each time we send off a box of recycling, the Town Council receives points as a reward. These points can be transferred into funds for selected TerraCycle schools, charities and Non-Profit organisations. This way not only can we help the environment, but we can support other causes too! In October we were able to collect enough points to send £56.89 to the Children in Need.

Batteries and Ink Cartridges

The Town Council also collect used batteries and ink cartridges (not through TerraCycle). Funds raised from lnk Cartridges goes to Hungry UK and from used batteries goes to Food Bank UK.

View from the Chair

On behalf of the town council, officers, and members - welcome to the eleventh edition of our newsletter. In each issue we hope to engage with more and more residents as it is you who drive the achievements of the Town Council.

In August I reported the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) was nearing completion and in September we held two consultation meetings, the first was on Zoom the second at the United Reform Church and by the time this newsletter goes to print, a third will have taken place at the Town Council office. Your responses to the consultation survey are vital, the deadline is 5pm 19th November 2021. The 'made' NP will provide us with the legal power to ensure appropriate development is delivered in Westgate on Sea. The number of houses and the exact location are the business of the Local Plan, provided by Thanet District Council (TDC) and without a Local Plan developers would be able to build without any restraints. An NP provides policies on many aspects including overall design, open spaces. and the preservation of heritage, without which Westgate on Sea's unique character could be lost.

The new post office location reported on in the previous newsletter, is now thriving thanks to everyone's patronage.

This September we were invited to comment on the second consultation for the active travel scheme put forward by Kent County Council (KCC) in response to the government's Active Travel Fund, funding intended to provide improved walking and cycling facilities. The first consultation for the Thanet Scheme (there were seven Kent wide, with only one adopted) took place between December 2020 to January 2021 with just over two hundred responses, this is an extremely low figure considering the number of electorates throughout Thanet. The consultation recently closed on the 25th October with an overall thumb's down response, we expressed the hope that the existing coastal route will be recognised as beneficial for active travel and leisure. Lately KCC Highways have carried out basic maintenance to the cycle paths along the A28 which are now useable, although further improvements would be welcomed to encourage their use.

In early October, the Town Council received two resignations, which created what are known as 'casual vacancies' literally - a by chance vacancy, outside of election years.

Casual vacancies are categorised by specific circumstances: a failure to accept office, death. resignation, disqualification, and failure to attend meetings. In both instances the Town Council casual vacancies were by resignation. You can read the definitive explanation of the ensuing process of co-option in the article by the Town Clerk.

Over the last two months Westgate on Sea Business Forum has come on in leaps and bounds, but not without dedicated hard work and the hours put in with face-to-face communication certainly paid off. The recent TDC Fiver Fest saw twenty-two businesses in Westgate on Sea taking part in highlighting the undeniable positives of a thriving high street, the friendliness alone is enough to boost even the most curmudgeonly amongst us. If you are reading this and run a business in Westgate on Sea, do join the Forum to raise the profile of small businesses within the town, across Thanet and nationwide.

Local provides so much more than just a bargain. The Christmas Fair is only a week or two away, communities are keen to get out and about, the Business Forum is working together to make our annual fair a reflection of the best of Westgate on Sea's town.



Never think councillors do not get their hands dirty! one Sunday this month the town clerk and three councillors took kettle, mop & bucket etc to the changing rooms at the newly transferred recreation ground. The little building is structurally sound and fundamentally in very good condition. There are some heritage features which will hopefully continue to be preserved as they are practical and in good order; the high-level cisterns, and the original drainage outlets which have been sensibly incorporated into the modern wet room flooring, which even die-hard heritage supporters must admit is preferable to any original and cracked floor tiling.

Alongside councillors and officers are residents who give their time to care about the culture of the town. The images (taken this autumn) show the work and care which benefits the town's image. In addition, a spotlight must shine on two young Westgate on Sea Mums who bother to litter pick. One Mum litter picks with her children walking from school the other, a Mum of teenagers, litter picks after helping at breakfast club. The more the merrier and the cleaner Westgate on Sea will be!

In December we have the annual fair, and Christmas itself will soon be upon us. The community has come through the original lockdowns to a point where we now feel a little safer socialising, despite the media reports, and we are willing to come together when the peace of the town is threatened. Supporting us, and in partnership with our town council officers, we have the truly engaged KCC Community Warden, Community Connectors and PCSO. The Town Council's recently established Community Clinic is an opportunity to meet the team, and last month everyone was kept busy with questions from residents. Another 'team' member is the new Neighbourhood Watch coordinator; she also attends the Community Clinic reassuring and providing top tips and handy hints for safer neighbourhoods.

Westgate on Sea Town Council wishes everyone a happy Christmas Festival and a healthy and happy New Year. In 2022 we have the potential to build on the engagement and unity established in 2021, with the preservation of our shared environment taking centre stage; initiatives and ideas will emerge from the 26th Conference of the Parties (COP26) to assist us all, every small action, every step, adds to the securing of our environment for future generations.

St Saviours Community Hub

A New and Exciting Project to Support and Enhance the Community of Westgate on Sea.

Introduction and Overview

A Church often seems to be a place that is only open on a Sunday. Which is great, but why can it not be used for the benefit of local people throughout the week? After all, it is a community asset. St Saviours Church in Westgate has this in mind. It is a huge, grand building on a prime site right in the middle of the town and one of the most architecturally stunning. Mother Karen Gooding has the vision that St Saviours could and should be better utilised as an integral part of the community that it serves. With an "open door" welcoming policy to everyone in Westgate and the surrounding district. That door will be open seven days a week, not just on Sunday.

St Saviours will develop into an important focal point for residents, essentially operating as a "hub" for the community - to be used by local people and adopted by community groups. who in turn provide a comprehensive variety of services, facilities and, therefore, activities. The aim is that the church will bring people together in a way that it never has before.

The main innovation of the project is to use the garden area, which is a far bigger space than it looks at the moment and building a Garden Room. This will act as the "Shop Front" for the project. To work on the project's development, an enthusiastic team of parishioners has been organised and they are collaborating with John Bailey of Thomas Ford Architects, with additional support and backing from Westgate-on-Sea Town Council, specifically Cllr David Donaldson and the Town Clerk, Gill Gray.

The Community Garden, and Garden Room

The garden area obviously has huge potential and can become a little oasis right in the middle of town. It will incorporate a Garden Room, which will be built as an extension to the main church with an entry through the Church gateway in St Mildred's Road. The entrance and doorways will be ergonomically designed to allow easy and convenient access.

The design and construction will be very modern and most importantly have green credentials, but without being out of context with the beautiful architecture of the main church building.



The roof will have the appearance of slates, but will be constructed of photo-voltaic cells to provide solar electricity. This, combined with modern insulation, will create a very energy efficient structure.

As with all gardens, for the community garden to thrive, it will need a prolific supply of water and the architects are thinking through how rainwater can be used, not just from the garden room, but also rainwater from the main church roof which can be utilised and stored. They are also designing a solar powered pump configuration. that will be required for the irrigation of the garden. The Garden Room will have the capacity to accommodate 40+ people at any one time.

It will physically be built in the space between the two photographs below, and connected to the church building through the Vestry door at the right-hand side.





Services and Facilities

These will be all inclusive, covering mothers and toddlers right through to Ageless Thanet. The church is very proactive in encouraging community groups and indeed individuals to make their "home" there.

It is a case of building up the usage and ensuring current groups continue to thrive such as the Westgate Heritage Centre.

The Key is Partnership

The project recognised right from the beginning that working in partnership with community groups is the underlying key to successful community development. To be able to provide comprehensive services and facilities for local people the project will focus on working on and developing close partnership with the multitude of groups that already exist in Westgate and the surrounding areas.

Even though the project is at an embryonic stage, outreach work has already begun, and has been effective.

One such project is "Looking Ahead" which operates primarily from Minster, but also has The King Street Studio and Gallery in Margate. Their success has spanned over a period of 17 vears. It provides its users with a whole range of interesting and educational activities; arts and crafts, woodwork, gardening and cooking skills.

Looking Ahead have committed themselves to being part of the project, and welcome St Saviour's innovative approach, and the enthusiasm and support from Westgate Town Council, whose offices exist, divinely, under the shadow of St Saviours Church.

Finance and Funding

To pull this off the project will require quite a heavy initial investment to build the Garden Room. There are numerous charities, trusts and organisations that would be willing to contribute to such a venture but the core funding will be from the National Lottery.

This Fund provides millions of pounds into community projects both for capital and revenue expenditure.
